



TIMELY WARNING/SAFETY ALERT

West Valley & Mission College Campuses

Incident Type: Annoy or Molest a Child/ Battery/ Suspicious Behavior

Date: 04/23/26

The purpose of this notice is to empower students and employees to protect themselves and prevent similar crimes. Call 911 if you see this person or have any information which may help in the investigation.

Details: On 04/22/26, officers received new information connecting the suspect depicted below to several incidents at both West Valley College and Mission College during March-April 2026. Based on the reports, the individual may pose an on-going threat to campus safety.

Incident #1

West Valley College - On 03/04/26, between 5:00-5:40 PM, a female student was studying in a music practice room, Cilker building, West Valley College. The suspect entered the music room and tried to engage her in conversation. The suspect claimed he could assist her with a music career and attempted to show her his phone which displayed pornographic images. The suspect left when the victim's friend approached to find out what was happening.

Incident #2

West Valley College - On 03/10/26, at approximately 3:50 PM, a suspicious person matching the description of the suspect from the 03/04/26 incident, was contacted by officers in the Cilker building, West Valley College. The individual was not a student and left campus after being advised by officers not to loiter in the area or interact with students and staff.

Incident #3

Mission College - On 03/16/26, between 3:00-3:30 PM, the suspect approached two female juveniles who were sitting inside the Visio Building, Mission College. The suspect entered the building, walked past the juveniles while staring at them over his shoulder. The suspect left the building but immediately returned and started talking to the juveniles. He asked personal questions and made several comments that were sexual in nature. The suspect also took their phones and attempted to access them. Both juveniles were uncomfortable and told the suspect they were minors, but he was not deterred. The suspect sat down next to one of the juveniles and attempted to touch her multiple times with his body.

Incident #4

Mission College - On 04/21/26, at approximately 1:00PM, while officers were following up on the previous incident, Library staff identified the suspect in a photograph and reported that he was routinely "hanging out" in the library during March 2026 and early April 2026. He identified himself as "Eddy", claimed to be a student, and regularly left personal property unattended. He made unusual and spontaneous statements not directed at anyone that were overheard by others. Library staff never received a report that he engaged in inappropriate conduct with others.

SUSPECT DESCRIPTION:

Black Male Adult, 35 years old, 6'3" tall, 220 lbs.

Short Blk. hair, Brn. eyes, some facial hair

In all the incidents referenced above, the suspect wore the [Blue LA Dodgers](#) baseball cap, sunglasses, and long Khaki colored trench coat style coat seen in this picture. He is also known to wear bright blue converse tennis shoes
