

TIMELY WARNING – SAFETY ALERT

Mission College

Incident Type: Disruptive Behavior/Suspicious Circumstances

Dates Occurred: June 20, 2022, June 28, 2022

DETAILS: On June 20, 2022 the subject shown below walked into the Mission College VALOR Veteran's Center and did not respond when he was asked if he needed help. The subject emptied an entire basket of candy into a plastic bag, declined needing assistance and left the area. On June 28, 2022 the subject walked into the Mission College VALOR Veteran's Center and took food items. He was asked to take only one item and replied to the employee, but the subject's response was unintelligible. On June 28, 2022 the subject also walked into a retirement celebration being held in TAV-130 and grabbed a plate of food. The incidents previously mentioned were reported on June 29, 2022. Although the subject's actions in this incident were not disruptive, he was contacted by a Mission College administrator and another employee. The subject's identity was established and employees recognized the subject as being involved in a prior bank robbery and a prior attempted bank robbery in Milpitas, CA several years earlier. On June 29, 2022 the subject was contacted outside the Mission College Library. He admitted to being inside a women's restroom on the second floor of the SEC building earlier in the day and claimed it was accidental. The subject was not cooperative with law enforcement during his contact on June 29, 2022. He was issued a 626.6(a) PC notice prohibiting him from being on the Mission College campus for a period of seven days. If you see the subject on the Mission College campus prior to 3:00 pm on July 6, 2022, please contact the District Police.

SUBJECT DESCRIPTION: The subject was identified as Thomas J. Davis, DOB 08/08/1994. He has a slim build, with bleached orange colored hair and some facial hair.

Safety Tips

1. PROGRAM CAMPUS POLICE DISPATCH NUMBERS INTO YOUR PHONE – Within the campus community our police department can respond to emergencies faster than local law enforcement. The seven digit 9-1-1 number is: 408-299-3233
2. REPORT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY – Criminals do not want to be seen or heard. We rely on the community to report suspicious activity. We would much rather respond and not be needed than to not be called when something could have been prevented or stopped. Trust your instincts; if something does not feel right, it probably isn't.
3. BE AWARE OF YOUR SURROUNDINGS – Avoid going to secluded areas of the campus alone. If you are going into a dark or concealed area of the campus, find a trusted classmate or colleague to go to these areas with you.
